# Peel Trauma Screening Training

Family Services of Peel (FSP) is pleased to announce the launch of our Online Learning Academy with the release of our first course, Peel Trauma Screening Training.

As of June 1, 2020, the Peel Trauma Screening Training is available online - internationally. This innovative trauma screening course was developed by Peel Institute on Violence Prevention and the Seamless Services for Mental Health, Addiction and Trauma Committee, a collaboration of over 12 organizations. They came together in 2012 to address the need to improve mental health, addictions and trauma services in Peel through a universal screening tool. Developed over the course of 5 years, the training is primarily informed by a social justice perspective utilizing the social determinants of health and well-being, the trauma screening tool and how to use it and trauma stewardship.

On completion of the course you will learn how to conduct trauma screening based on an understanding of the social context of trauma, the connection between inequity, oppression and trauma and the impact of service providers' social position in relation to their clients.

The course is for human and social services workers, psychologists, psychiatrists, nurses, doctors, police officers, front-line worker from any sector and anyone interested in knowing how to screen for trauma.
