CEO Spotlight: Hayley Kennedy

Hayley Kennedy is the Executive Director of PARTNERS Family Services Inc. a non-profit organization based in Humboldt, SK. PARTNERS Family Services Inc. is a multi-funded agency committed to nurturing positive choices that sustain healthy individuals and communities through support, education, and partnerships. The agency takes a particular interest in working with individuals and families who have experienced family violence.

With 16 years of experience working in the non-profit sector in Ontario, Saskatchewan, and British Columbia, Hayley is a young and energetic activist with a particular interest in examining and utilizing existing resources in creative and innovative ways to meet the needs of vulnerable individuals and families.

Beginning in 2003, Hayley took a particular interest in the nonprofit sector and its ability to implement change at the individual and community level using limited resources. In her first role as an outreach program coordinator with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Kingston, ON, Hayley quickly established both a passion for working with at-risk youth and a compelling ability to guickly connect with



families, work with them to identify their goals, and connect them with resources.

In 2008, Hayley joined the dynamic team at the Sudbury Action Centre for Youth where she was instrumental in bringing a recreational program for street entrenched youth to the centre. Through this process, Hayley established herself as a talented grant writer and program developer. Through the delivery of this and other programs, Hayley grew into a skilled facilitator, public speaker, and advocate.

After relocating to Saskatchewan in 2010, Hayley continued to pursue her passion for working with vulnerable youth and families with Boys and Girls Clubs of Saskatoon and Quint Development Corporation. In her roles as program coordinators, Hayley worked tirelessly with at risk families and their children both as a frontline worker and as an advocate for increased access to supports and services within Saskatoons highest risk and lowest income neighbourhoods. In these roles, Hayley continued to develop strong research skills in the areas of interpersonal relationships, parenting, and domestic violence. Hayley worked with countless families in these areas and is proud to have been a part of their stories.

After a brief relocation to Vancouver Island, BC and working with children in the disability sector, Hayley returned to Saskatchewan to pursue further work with at risk families. In her role as Executive Director, Hayley has been instrumental in increasing service provision in rural Central Saskatchewan; expanding services to isolated communities; increasing advocacy services; and bringing concerns from the rural service area to the provincial table. Hayley provides workshops to schools, employers, and other CBOs in the areas of mental health, interpersonal relationships, and family violence. Currently, Hayley sits on the Board of Directors for Saskatchewan Sexual Assault Services, and Family Service Saskatchewan. Hayley is a proud Alumni of Queen's University with a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology and English and recently completed a Master of Arts in Community Development. She is a mother of two young children and lives in Humboldt, SK with her partner Cody and their two corgis.

We have other programs such as Cooperative Parenting and Divorce. This video-based program helps divorcing parents shield their children from parental conflict. Parents learn to guide their children through the process of recovery while establishing a positive, long-term relationship with the child's other parent.
