Critical Incident Response Training Series: Best Practices for Critical Incident Response in the Workplace

This four-part module webinar series builds on best practices literature and provides a comprehensive overview of how to deliver critical incident response services that promote psychological safety, wellbeing, and resilience among employees and teams after experiencing a traumatic incident in the workplace.

This training covers the nature and frequency of critical incidents in the workplace, how to incorporate Psychological First Aid (PFA) and the A.C.T. Model principles into practice with individuals and workgroups, and how to organize response to incidents in the workplace. Additional focus will be placed on exercising cultural competency in the workplace setting, responding to mass disasters, and how to promote resiliency and self-care.

A critical element of a robust employee assistance program is being prepared to respond to critical or traumatic incidents in the workplace. This training provides hands on simulations of applying critical incident response in various contexts. This includes consultation and support to leaders, as well as 1:1 and group interventions for employees, to assist the impacted workplace to return to functioning and stability.
